#### **BUDGET UPDATE 8-18-17**

I am writing this afternoon to make you aware of a press conference that occurred today, click here for more information. Given what was conveyed, I need to ask for your help as school and community members. Though I am not a resident of Tolland, I went into education because I care about children, and communities. It is my life's purpose. My own community grapples with these impacts as well. We have to demand together as citizens in affected communities that the State stop using our most vulnerable as a pawn. There can be reorganization without recklessness. Tolland is 49<sup>th</sup> in equalized Mill rate, and 16<sup>th</sup> from the bottom in Per Pupil Expenditure. It has a limited commercial and retail base. It is absolutely unacceptable to suggest that Tolland should sustain what could be a \$8.5-million-dollar loss in ECS alone in one year. It is not acceptable to instigate fear and desperation in the community of Tolland to achieve a political end; it tears apart a community, burns out its volunteers in local government, and wrecks the social fabric required for productive change.

The Governor's proposal appears to be another attempt to compel the legislature to act by imposing severe impacts. Equity is vital to our State's future, and that has to be understood and supported, but <u>rhetoric is made reality</u> when communities have to interpret what "could be" because the State takes little perceivable action and threatens to impose draconian solutions. Any plan that hurts our most vulnerable, be it children, or those in need of emergency services, is <u>not the right plan</u>. The State legislature is actually taking action by its inaction. It is facilitating the disintegration of relationships

that are the backbone of your community. Please, call your legislators every day, and ask them what they have done *today* to find a better way forward. Locally, let us not accept the role of a pawn. Let us not let the rhetoric ruin our reality. Let us do what we have to do to weather the storm – and foster responsible change.
