Veterans Day Celebration

On Friday, November 11, THS celebrated Veterans Day to honor and recognize the men and women who have served in our nation's military. The goal of the program was to help students develop a deeper appreciation for our veterans, recommit our support of those still in uniform, and honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice to preserve our way of life.

Students listened to Mrs. Fox' short speech about how the Treaty of Versailles was signed on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, signifying the end of World War I and the armistice between Germany and the Allied nations. One year later, Armistice Day was celebrated for the first time on November 11, 1919 to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during World War I. In 1938, Congress approved November 11th as a federal holiday and then in 1954, veteran's service organizations urged Congress to change the word "Armistice" to "Veterans".

Students viewed a powerful Veterans Day video and were introduced to a local hero. Senior **Annalee Hughes** spoke about her **Recycling for our Wounded Veterans** program and donated a \$1,000 check to Lance Corporal Conor Beck who graduated from Fermi High School in Enfield, Connecticut in 2009. Enlisting in the United States Marine Corps, he completed his basic training at Parris Island in South Carolina. In the military, he served as a gunner on a quick recovery force truck for the 33rd Georgian Brigade while stationed in Afghanistan. On June 28, 2011, Lance Corporal Bock sustained injuries when the truck he was riding in was hit by an Improvised Explosive Device (IED). He is the recipient of the prestigious Purple Heart Award.

Congressman Joe Courtney, a representative from Senator Chris Murphy's office, and a former recipient of Annalee's donation, Micah Welintukonis, were on hand to present Annalee and Connor with certificates. Over the past four years, Annalee has donated over \$6,000 to wounded veterans.
