Four Tolland High School business students were recently honored at the Connecticut Stock Market Game's 2017 Awards Ceremony held at the Hartford Courant on Wednesday, May 31. The event is sponsored by the SIFMA Foundation which is dedicated to fostering knowledge and understanding of the financial markets for individuals of all backgrounds. The Connecticut Stock Market Game is played statewide by Connecticut schools throughout the school year. THS students participate in the Connecticut Stock Market Game while taking various business classes. Students are given \$100,000 of "money" to invest in stocks, bonds, and mutual funds of their choosing. How the students perform in the game depends on how their investments actually perform in the real market. Winning students for Tolland included Kevin Shorey, Jack Lester, Luke Nehrig, and Hamzah Hassan.


Sophomore Kevin Shorey took first place in the Fall 2016 competition by turning in his investment into \$208,457.25 while second place finisher senior Jack Lester made a cool \$179,438.34. Freshman Luke Nehrig took first place in the Spring 2017 competition as his investment grew to \$156,712.34 while sophomore Hamzah Hassan finished approximately \$10,000 behind at \$146.676.86. Not a bad investment for a ten-week period! For both Shorey and Hassan it was their second time receiving an award. Look out Wall Street!!!!

STUDENTS MUST REMAIN IN THE EXAM FOR THE ENTIRE 90 MINUTES.

- Students excused or exempt from exams do not need to report to school.
- Students who are in school and not taking exams must be in the cafeteria while exams are in progress. A student may be in the library but must make arrangements with the library staff in advance to do so.
- The make-up exam period is only for those students who have special problems approved in advance by the department chairperson.
- All students are expected to be in their exams on time. Forgetting, sleeping late, etc. are not excuses for missing a final exam.
- Students who have just one exam on either day only need to be here for their exam period. For example, if you have only a Block 1 exam and you have your own transportation, you may leave after the end of the Block 1 exam period. The reverse is also true. If you have only a Block 2 exam and you are able to provide

- your own transportation to school, you do not need to be here during the Block 1 exam period. However, you must be on time to the Block 2 exam period.
- Students are not to leave the school building in between exam periods.
- Buses will arrive and depart school at the regularly scheduled time on Thursday, June 15, 2017. Buses will depart at 10:45 a.m. on Friday, June 16th. There will be no late bus.
