# THS DECA Hosts Event to Benefit Operation Gratitude

It's about saying, "Thank you." Every year, Operation Gratitude (501c3) sends 150,000+ individually-addressed care packages to Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Marines deployed overseas and to their children left behind. To date they have sent over 1.5 million care packages! Operation Gratitude gives Americans the opportunity to show their appreciation and support.

On May 24<sup>th</sup>, Tolland High School DECA hosted its second school-wide community service event. With Memorial Day as the backdrop, a team of THS DECA students were looking for a way they could pay tribute to the brave men and women that protect and serve. They successfully researched, organized, and implemented a "care kit" packaging event held at THS. These care kits will be sent to Operation Gratitude to become part of their widely recognized care packages.

Mrs. Bridge's Marketing class designed targeted marketing plans that would inform and energize various audiences, while dedicated DECA students created an introductory video, designed promotional flyers, wrote morning announcements and school-wide advisory scripts, and implemented an online donation system and QR code linked to an informational webpage. Tolland Middle School students also joined in with a "*Dress in Red, White, and Blue for Operation Gratitude*" Day where they raised over \$300! Together we raised over \$7000 in cash donations, and obtained over 13,500 individual products to include in the care kits. The entire student body twisted and knotted 900 paracord bracelets (survival bracelets) and created over 1000 care kits to send to Operation Gratitude.

#### STUDENTS MUST REMAIN IN THE EXAM FOR THE ENTIRE 90 MINUTES.

- Students excused or exempt from exams do not need to report to school.
- Students who are in school and not taking exams must be in the cafeteria while exams are in progress. A student may be in the library but must make arrangements with the library staff in advance to do so.
- The make-up exam period is only for those students who have special problems approved in advance by the department chairperson.

- All students are expected to be in their exams on time. Forgetting, sleeping late, etc. are not excuses for missing a final exam.
- Students who have just one exam on either day only need to be here for their exam period. For example, if you have only a Block 1 exam and you have your own transportation, you may leave after the end of the Block 1 exam period. The reverse is also true. If you have only a Block 2 exam and you are able to provide your own transportation to school, you do not need to be here during the Block 1 exam period. However, you must be on time to the Block 2 exam period.
- Students are not to leave the school building in between exam periods if they have two exams on the same day.
- Buses will arrive and depart school at the regularly scheduled time on Wednesday, June 15, 2016.
- Buses will depart at 11:57 on Thursday, June 16th. There will be no late bus.
