TOLLAND MIDDLE SCHOOL RECEIVES LOWE'S TOOLBOX FOR EDUCATION GRANT FOR OUTDOOR PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AREA

\$4,000 will provide funding toward the project

Tolland, CT – The Lowe's Charitable and Educational Foundation has awarded a \$4,000 Lowe's Toolbox for Education® grant to Tolland Middle School and their Parent Teacher Organization for installation of an Outdoor Physical Activity Area that will be utilized by all students and integrated into their physical education curriculum. This exciting Outdoor Physical Activity Area supports and improves the current fitness-based PE curriculum, encourages physical fitness for the students, and gives them the ability to participate in a variety of team activities, games and sports. This new area can also be utilized by every teacher in the building in conjunction with the school's (nationally recognized) PBIS program which creates positive school environments for students. It will include two adjustable basketball hoop systems, up to four Tetherball courts, and four 4-square game areas. The project is scheduled to be completed by September 2017.
