


- o HVAC Filters changed in December and April by WillScott


EXTERIOR/OUTDOOR INSPECTION: <u>Ground Level:</u> no walk-about



Some staff using the room bring in clearners not approved. The room is often humid and the air is stale. It is better when the window can be opened and fresh air is let in to clear the air, but the window does leak at times. Water runs down the window on the outside like a waterfall when snow melts or it is raining.
